Help Is Here

The Morris County Sexual Assault Center offers free and confidential support to survivors of sexual violence, ages 13 and older, who live in Morris County, as well as their loved ones. Feelings associated with sexual violence can be difficult to understand on your own. We offer:

- 24-hour crisis and emotional support, call 973-829-0587
- Individual counseling and support groups
- Advocacy services
- Community education
- An advocate to go with you to the hospital or police department

If at any time in your life, you or someone you care about experienced sexual assault, child sexual abuse, sexual harassment, non-consensual sexual contact, or any unwanted sexual experience, we are here to support you.

What You May Be Experiencing After Sexual Violence

All of the feelings listed below are common reactions to sexual violence. Know we are here to help. Calling the Morris County Sexual Assault Center can be the first step in healing from the effects of sexual trauma, which can include:

- Shock, fear, guilt or shame
- Depression or anxiety
- Difficulty concentrating or sleeping
- Thoughts of suicide
- Flashbacks or nightmares

Healing Is a Process

When you call the Morris County Sexual Assault Center you can expect to speak with a trained professional who will gather information and connect you with the appropriate services. We can help you begin the healing process working with a private therapist or in a group setting.

Individual and Group Counseling

Our staff of specially trained clinicians offer free short-term counseling to survivors and their loved ones. Each individual is treated with respect, dignity and compassion. All of our sessions remain strictly confidential. If you require longer term care, we will provide referrals to highly qualified resources throughout Morris County.



Support groups are available to those who wish to speak to individuals with similar experiences in a safe and confidential setting.

24-Hour Support

24-hour crisis and emotional support are available through our hotline at 973-829-0587. We are available to provide information or to go with a survivor to a police station or hospital.

Community Education and Prevention

We are dedicated to creating a safer community. We present to schools, community organizations, and other groups about consent, healthy relationships, trauma informed care and more.

Volunteer Program

Interested in helping survivors in your community? We offer a free 40-hour training to become a Confidential Sexual Violence Advocate and support survivors on our hotline, at police stations or at hospitals.
